4.1.Methodological overview

The learning process that has been designed for this subject is based on the following:

The main teaching method that is proposed for the theoretical classes of the subject is the lecture, being the convenience such choice justified by the characteristics of the students, who have no previous knowledge about the subject.

However, for the exhibition in class different techniques are proposed to stimulate participation, and with it the teacher-student interrelation, as well as to try to increase their level of attention and facilitate the follow-up of the topic. Among them, it is intended to use a combined system of explanation supported by questions to students, which allows the teacher to see if they are paying attention, are understanding the explanation and if they acquire the elementary

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knowledge necessary to follow the reasoning. This system will be complemented with the use of multiple real examples, fundamentally of sports organizations known and close to the students, in order to awaken their interest, trying to provoke, in addition, their participation.

As far as the means are concerned, for the theoretical class of the subject PowerPoint presentations will be used, in which express reference will be made to the printed media that gather the different concepts and aspects that will be discussed in the proposed program. Also, the plastic board will be used, both as a stand in itself to qualify some aspects of the explanation, as a projection support to be able to paint and overwrite the presentations.

The practical classes will serve as a complement to the theory by allowing the concepts analyzed to be applied, completing some less developed aspects or proposing new questions. These practical classes are intended to be developed in the following different ways:

- a) The use of case studies, usually presented on video, that show real situations and in which students individually or by group can try to find problems (inefficiencies, negligence, etc.) and suggest solutions. In this way, students can use the knowledge and techniques learned in class to apply them to real situations.
- b) The discussion of texts, selected among the articles of specialized journals of recognized prestige and related to the topics discussed in class so that the student participates more actively in the theoretical classes.
- c) The resolution of exercises on the board, where the concepts studied in the corresponding chapters apply. The resolution of these exercises in the waxing allows the student to reason and understand the mechanism of resolution of them.

Finally, students will be urged to use the tutorial hours to resolve specific questions, for any other matter that the student is interested in relation to the subject.

The objective of the subject is to familiarize the student with the organization and management of sports associations through the study of their different figures, the characteristics of their management and the legislation that affects them. - d) To know the functions and characteristics of the Arbitration Court of Sport.

A part dedicated to the characteristic aspects of associative figures of the second degree and foundations follows ::

- a) Types or modalities.
- b) Legal nature.
- c) Constitution.
- d) Organic structure.
- e) Economic-financial regime.

The third block is devoted to knowing the particularities of associative figures of the second degree or clubs:

- a) General aspects.
- b) Constitution.
- c) Integration in the respective sports federations.
- d) Organic structure.
- e) Economic-financial regime.
- f) Dissolution.
