4.1.Methodological overview

"Prácticas externas" is an especial course where the students work as trainees at local companies and institutions. The internship is organised in order to provide the students with a good preparation for a real enterprise environment. The students are given the opportunity to apply the knowledges acquired in the classroom, to improve their abilities for team work and to acquire a valuable experience which could lead to better job oportunities in the future.

A system of double-supervision is established, since the trainee has the support of an academic supervisor from the Geography Department and another supervisor within the firm/institution of the internship.

4.2.Learning tasks

The course includes the following learning tasks:

- Guidance interview with the academic supervisor and with the firm/institution supervisor: 6 hours
- Work in the placement firm/institution: 108 hours
- Monitoring meetings with the academic supervisor: 6 hours
- Preparation and writing of a final report: 30 hours
